## OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE YEAR

### Isaiah Pead • Sr. • RB • Cincinnati • Columbus, Ohio

Pead led the BIG EAST with 11 rushing touchdowns and was second in the conference in rushing, averaging 92.5 yards per game. He enters the postseason with 1,110 rushing yards and ranks second in the BIG EAST in scoring – first among non-kickers – with 84 points. Pead also had 36 receptions for 304 yards and three touchdowns.



## DEFENSIVE PLAYERS OF THE YEAR

### Derek Wolfe • Sr. • DT • Cincinnati • Lisbon, Ohio

Wolfe led the BIG EAST with 19.5 tackles for loss and had 9.5 sacks. He is the focal point of a Bearcat defense that limited opponents to just 92.7 rushing yards per game – good for second in the BIG EAST – and a league-low eight rushing touchdowns.



### Khaseem Greene • Jr. • LB • Rutgers • Elizabeth, N.J.

Greene finished the regular season with a BIG EAST-leading 127 tackles – 20 more than anyone else in the conference – while averaging 10.6 stops per game. He is the key man on a Scarlet Knight defense that leads the BIG EAST in total defense (311.5 yards per game) and scoring defense (18.8 points per game).



## SPECIAL TEAMS PLAYER OF THE YEAR

### Tavon Austin • Jr. • WR • West Virginia • Baltimore, Md.

Austin leads the BIG EAST and is ranked second nationally in all-purpose yards (191.2 yards per game), is the league leader in punt returns (14.1 yards per return) and is second in the conference in kickoff returns (26.5 yards per return). Austin is the only BIG EAST player to return two kickoffs for touchdowns this season.



## ROOKIE OF THE YEAR

### Teddy Bridgewater • Fr. • QB • Louisville • Miami, Fla.

Bridgewater became Louisville's starting quarterback in the fourth game of the season and led the Cardinals to five wins in their last six games to earn a share of the BIG EAST championship. He enters the postseason ranked third in the BIG EAST in pass efficiency rating (136.1) after throwing for 1,855 yards and 12 touchdowns in the regular season.



## COACH OF THE YEAR

### Butch Jones • Cincinnati

Jones engineered a five-win turnaround from last season, leading Cincinnati to a share of the BIG EAST championship and an appearance in the AutoZone Liberty Bowl after a 9-3 regular season. The Bearcats were picked fifth in the BIG EAST preseason media poll, but ended up earning a share of their third conference title in four years.

## Any Team, Any Game

Every BIG EAST team finished with at least five wins in 2011. The only other time that an existing Bowl Subdivision conference had each member finish with at least five wins was in 1904 and 1905, when the Big Nine (now the Big Ten) had all of its members with at least five victories.

## No Layups Here

The BIG EAST is the only Bowl Subdivision conference in which each member won at least four games in 2011. In fact, the BIG EAST is the only FBS conference without a team that won three or fewer games.

## We're All In

The BIG EAST is the only Division I conference that has seen each of its members play in at least one bowl game in the past two seasons. The BIG EAST is also the only league in which each team has at least one bowl win in the last four years.

## When It Counts

The BIG EAST has the best postseason record of any Bowl Subdivision conference during the Bowl Championship Series era.

## On The National Stage

BIG EAST representatives have won four of their last seven Bowl Championship Series games.

## Logjam

West Virginia, Cincinnati and Louisville finished in a three-way tie for the BIG EAST Championship in 2011, marking the second straight year in which three teams tied for the conference title. Connecticut, Pittsburgh and West Virginia shared the championship in 2010.

## What Do They Know?

Louisville, which was picked seventh in the BIG EAST preseason media poll, became the lowest preseason selection to win a share of the conference title. Connecticut (in 2007) and Cincinnati (2008) both won BIG EAST titles after being picked fifth in the respective preseason polls.

## This Sounds Familiar

Cincinnati won a share of its third BIG EAST title in four years in the 2011 season.

## Paper Or Plastic

The BIG EAST had three teams among the top four nationally in sacks in 2011. Cincinnati was second in the nation (3.46 per game), while Pittsburgh was third (3.31) and USF fourth (3.25).

## Shattered

Rutgers receiver Mohamed Sanu shattered the BIG EAST single-season receptions record, which had been held since 2003 by Larry Fitzgerald of Pittsburgh. Sanu had 115 catches this season, surpassing Fitzgerald's total of 92.

## Catching On

Mohamed Sanu finished the season ranked fifth nationally in receptions (8.9 rpg).

## Ten Grand

Connecticut running back Lyle McCombs became just the 10th BIG EAST freshman to surpass 1,000 rushing yards in a season (1,151). He is the first BIG EAST rookie to break 1,000 yards since Dion Lewis of Pittsburgh did it in 2009.

## Overhaul

West Virginia quarterback Geno Smith set BIG EAST records for pass attempts (526), completions (346) and yards (4,385) in 2011.

## Any Way You Want It

West Virginia wide receiver Tavon Austin led the nation in all-purpose yards in 2011. Austin averaged 198 all-purpose yards per game.

## Excellent Coverage

Louisville allowed seven yards on punt returns in 2011.

## Totally Offensive

USF QB B.J. Daniels finished his junior year ranked eighth on the BIG EAST's career total offense chart. Daniels has 7,992 yards of total offense, leaving him 2,883 yards behind former USF QB Matt Grothe, who holds the record with 10,875 yards.

## A Change Would Do You Good

The BIG EAST is scheduled to undergo the following membership changes in the coming years:

- 2012 Temple replaces West Virginia
- 2013 Boise State, UCF, Houston, Memphis, San Diego State and SMU join the conference
- 2014 Pittsburgh and Syracuse depart

- DT Derek Wolfe shared the BIG EAST Defensive Player of the Year honor after finishing the regular season with a BIG EAST-leading 19.5 tackles for loss.

- LB Khaseem Greene led the BIG EAST in tackles (140) and was named BIG EAST Defensive Player of the Year.
- WR Mohamed Sanu shattered the BIG EAST single-season record with 115 receptions.

- K Dave Teggart finished his career fourth on the BIG EAST's career scoring list (350 points).
- Teggart joined DE Kendall Reyes and C Moe Petrus as selections to the All-BIG EAST First Team.
- Connecticut had six players chosen to the All-BIG EAST Second Team.

### POLL EXPLANATION & ABOUT THE BCS:

To derive a team's poll percentages in the Harris Interactive and *USA Today* polls, each team's point total is divided by a maximum 2850 possible points in the Harris Interactive Poll and 1475 possible points in the *USA Today* Poll. Teams are assigned a point total for each of their respective computer poll rankings to determine the overall computer component. The highest and lowest ranking for each team is dropped, and the sum total of the remaining four rankings is divided by 100 (the maximum possible points). This figure produces a Computer Rankings Percentage. The six computer ranking providers are Anderson & Hester (A&H), Richard Billingsley (B), Colley Matrix (CM), Kenneth Massey (M), Jeff Sagarin (S) and Peter Wolfe (W). Each computer ranking accounts for schedule strength within its formula. The BCS Average is calculated by averaging the percent totals of the Harris Interactive and USA Today Polls, and Computer rankings. The highest BCS Average receives the No. 1 ranking, the second highest receives No. 2, and so forth.

The BCS is a five-game arrangement for post-season college football that is managed by the 11 Bowl Subdivision conferences and Notre Dame. Its purpose is to match the two top-ranked teams in the final BCS standings in a national championship game and to create competitive matchups in the four other BCS bowl games. Cincinnati, Louisville and West Virginia – which finished in a three-way tie for the BIG EAST title – joined Rutgers as schools that had individual winners of the BIG EAST postseason football honors as chosen by the league's eight head coaches.

Cincinnati running back Isaiah Pead becomes the first Cincinnati player to be named BIG EAST Offensive Player of the Year and the fourth consecutive running back to earn the honor. Pead led the BIG EAST with 11 rushing touchdowns and was second in the conference in rushing, averaging 92.5 yards per game.

Defensive tackle Derek Wolfe is the first Cincinnati player to be named BIG EAST Defensive Player of the Year following a regular season in which he led the BIG EAST with 19.5 tackles for loss and had 9.5 sacks.

Linebacker Khaseem Greene likewise becomes the first Rutgers player to be chosen as BIG EAST Defensive Player of the Year. Greene finished the regular season with a BIG EAST-leading 127 tackles – 20 more than anyone else in the conference – while averaging 10.6 stops per game.

Tavon Austin is the third West Virginia player to earn BIG EAST Special Teams Player of the Year honors, joining punter Todd Sauerbrun, who won in 1994, and cornerback Adam Jones, who was the 2004 selection. Austin leads the BIG EAST and is ranked second nationally in all-purpose yards (191.2 yards per game), is the league leader in punt returns (14.1 yards per return) and is second in the conference in kickoff returns (26.5 yards per return).

Quarterback Teddy Bridgewater is the third Louisville player in the last four years to be named BIG EAST Rookie of the Year. Bridgewater became Louisville's starting quarterback in the fourth game of the season and led the Cardinals to five wins in their last six games to earn a share of the BIG EAST championship.

Butch Jones becomes Cincinnati's fourth BIG EAST Coach of the Year selection, after he engineered a five-win turnaround from last season, leading Cincinnati to a share of the BIG EAST championship.

## BOWL CHAMPIONSHIP SERIES

The Bowl Championship Series (BCS), which enters its 14th season in 2011-12, is a five-game arrangement for postseason college football that is designed to match the two top-rated teams in a national championship game and to create exciting and competitive matchups between eight other highly regarded teams in four other BCS games.

The BCS has been undeniably successful in achieving those goals. Thanks to the BCS, the top two teams have played each other 13 times in 13 years by BCS measurements and 10 times in the last 13 years according to the Associated Press poll. Additionally, it has provided more access to the major bowls for all 11 conferences, more television exposure and more postseason revenue than ever before.

The BCS also allows for preserving the significance of the regular season, which is the most meaningful in sports. It also maintains the bowl season to the benefit of dozens of universities each year.

The Tostitos Fiesta Bowl, Discover Orange Bowl, Allstate Sugar Bowl and Rose Bowl Game presented by Vizio joined with the BIG EAST, Atlantic Coast, Big Ten, Big 12, Pac-12 and Southeastern Conferences and the University of Notre Dame to form the Bowl Championship Series. In the existing BCS agreement, each bowl will host two games once every four years - its traditional game plus the BCS National Championship contest approximately one week later.

The BCS is managed by the commissioners of the 11 NCAA Football Bowl Subdivision conferences, the director of athletics at the University of Notre Dame and representatives of the bowl organizations. The conference commissioners and the Notre Dame athletics director make decisions regarding all BCS issues, in consultation with an athletics directors advisory group and subject to approval of a presidential oversight committee whose members represent all 120 Bowl Subdivision programs.

The BCS conferences have a contract with ESPN to televise the games through the 2013-14 season.



### BCS Automatic Qualifications

1. The top two teams in the final BCS standings will play in the National Championship Game.
2. The champions of the Atlantic Coast, Big East, Big Ten, Big 12, Pac-12, and Southeastern conferences will have automatic berths in one of the participating bowls each year through the 2013 regular season.
3. The champion of Conference USA, the Mid-American Conference, the Mountain West Conference, the Sun Belt Conference, or the Western Athletic Conference will earn an automatic berth in a BCS game if either: A. Such team is ranked in the top 12 of the final BCS Standings, or, B. Such team is ranked in the top 16 of the final BCS Standings and its ranking in the final BCS Standings is higher than that of a champion of a conference that has an annual automatic berth in one of the BCS bowls.
4. Notre Dame will automatically qualify for a BCS bowl if it is in the top eight of the final BCS Standings.
5. If any of the 10 slots remain open after application of provisions 1 through 4, and an at-large team from a conference with an annual automatic berth for its champion is ranked No. 3 in the final BCS Standings, that team shall become an automatic qualifier.
6. If any of the 10 slots remain open after application of provisions 1 through 5, and if Step No. 5 has not been applied and an at-large team from a conference with an annual automatic berth for its champion is ranked No. 4 in the final BCS Standings, that team shall become an automatic qualifier, provided that no at-large team from the same conference qualifies for the National Championship Game.
7. If any slots remain unfilled after the placement of all teams qualifying for an automatic berth, then the bowls shall choose their participants from the "pool of eligible teams" (see below.)

### Pool of Eligible Teams

If berths are available after the automatic qualifiers have been identified, then the bowls shall select at-large participants from the "pool of eligible teams," which shall include any Bowl Subdivision team that is bowl-eligible and meets the following requirements:

- A. Has won at least nine regular-season games, and
- B. Is among the top 14 teams in the final BCS Standings

# BIG EAST 2011 BOWL LINEUP

## The Lineup

In addition to the Bowl Championship Series, the BIG EAST Conference also has agreements with a number of other postseason bowl games. The conference's new lineup, which began in the 2010 season, has the BIG EAST paired against three of the other five automatic-qualifying Bowl Championship Series conferences in the postseason, giving the BIG EAST its strongest bowl partnerships in its history.

The BIG EAST announced a four-year agreement with Florida Citrus Sports and the Champs Sports Bowl to send a team to the Orlando, Fla., game beginning in the 2010 season.

The Champs Sports Bowl will have the first selection from the BIG EAST after the league's BCS representative has been determined. The BIG EAST's opponent in the Champs Sports Bowl will be from the Atlantic Coast Conference.

The Champs Sports Bowl will have the opportunity to select Notre Dame, in place of a BIG EAST team, once during the four-year agreement.

The BIG EAST has extended its agreement with the Belk Bowl in Charlotte, N.C., through the 2013 season as well. The Belk Bowl (previously known as the Meineke Car Care Bowl) will have the BIG EAST's third selection, after the BCS and Champs Sports Bowl.

The BIG EAST has been aligned with the Belk Bowl since the inception of the game in 2002. The game has averaged more than 62,000 fans and was named one of the five best startups in sports in the previous five years by Sports Business Journal.

The 2010 season featured the introduction of a new bowl game in New York City when the BIG EAST participated in the first New Era Pinstripe Bowl at Yankee Stadium. The New Era Pinstripe Bowl pits the fourth overall selection from the BIG EAST against a team from the Big 12 Conference. In the event that the Big 12 is unable to supply a team for the game, Notre Dame could step in as the opponent of the BIG EAST's representative.

The BIG EAST completed its bowl lineup in April 2010 by renewing deals with the BBVA Compass Bowl in Birmingham, Ala., and the Beef 'O'Brady's Bowl in St. Petersburg, Fla. The conference also announced a new agreement with the AutoZone Liberty Bowl in Memphis, Tenn. The BIG EAST will send teams to two of those three games in each of the 2010-13 seasons.

The BBVA Compass Bowl pairs a BIG EAST team against an opponent from the Southeastern Conference at Legion Field in Birmingham. BIG EAST teams are a combined 5-0 in the BBVA Compass Bowl.

If a BIG EAST team is chosen for the AutoZone Liberty Bowl, the conference's representative would face either the Conference USA champion or an opponent from the Southeastern Conference.

The Beef 'O' Brady's Bowl will be played for the fourth time in 2011 with the BIG EAST scoring wins in each of the first three games. The BIG EAST will face Conference USA at Tropicana Field in St. Petersburg.
