**West Virginia Captures Third Women's Soccer Crown
MORGANTOWN, W.Va.** – West Virginia (17-4-0) beat Louisville (12-6-3) by the score of 2-0 in the title game of the BIG EAST women's soccer championship on Nov. 6. With the win, the Mountaineers captured their second consecutive tournament title and third overall.

Mountaineers senior Blake Miller knocked home a penalty kick 27:13 into the contest to open the scoring. She was later named to the all-tournament team as well as the Most Outstanding Offensive Player.

WVU junior Bry McCarthy was named the tournament's Most Outstanding Defensive Player. Freshman goalkeeper Sara Keane was excellent in net making five saves to preserve the shutout. She also was named to the all-tournament team.

The match took place before a sun-baked capacity crowd of more than 1,550 at Dick Dlesk Soccer Stadium.

QUICK KICKS

12 NCAA WINS – BIG EAST teams totaled a league-record 12 wins during the 2010 NCAA Championship. The league was bouyed by six wins from national champion Notre Dame.

In 2011, the league totaled just three wins and did not have a team advance to the College Cup for the first time since 2005.

NCAA CHAMPIONSHIP BERTHS – The BIG EAST Conference has totaled 21 NCAA Championship berths over the past four years to average more than five teams a season. In addition, the league has seen a team (Notre Dame) advance to the College Cup in five years of the last six years.

LOUISVILLE SUCCESS – The 2011 campaign was a record-setter for the Cardinals, who finished their season with a 14-7-3 record. Louisville set a school record for wins, surpassing the previous mark of 13 set in back-to-back seasons in 2006 and 2007. The Cards also earned the program's first NCAA Championship wins with their 2-0 first round victory over Dayton and followed that with a 2-0 win at No. 5 Memphis in the second round.

The Cardinals also won their first BIG EAST National Division title and made their first BIG EAST Championship title game appearance.

The Cardinals closed the season with just three losses in their last 18 games overall. That stretch included a school record setting eight-game winning streak.

Senior Chloe Kiefer closed the season with a school record for goalkeeper minutes with 2,272 this season. She played every minute of every game in goal this season.



BIG EAST NEWS & NOTES

**Cincinnati (6-9-4)
2-7-2 BIG EAST**

- The Bearcats lost to Louisville 1-0 on Oct. 22 at home.
- The first 45 minutes was physical as both teams combined for 12 fouls, the same number of shots attempted. That trend continued in the second half as Louisville racked up 12 fouls and one yellow card, while UC recorded 11 fouls and two yellow cards.
- Prior to the match, Cincinnati's seven seniors – Logan Ballinger, Kelli Pawelko, Erin Kaufman, Erin Petree, Lauren Romanelli, Kay Young and Emily Hebbeler – were honored during pregame ceremonies as part of Senior Day festivities.

**Connecticut (7-8-2)
4-5-2 BIG EAST**

- The Huskies lost their regular-season finale 2-1 at Providence on Oct. 22.
- UConn was 2-3 against ranked opponents this year.
- It is the first time the Huskies did not qualify for the BIG EAST Championship since the tournament began in 1993.

**DePaul (3-14-1)
1-9-1 BIG EAST**

- The Blue Demons closed out the season with a 5-1 loss against Notre Dame on Oct. 21.
- This season showcased a youthful team working its way through growing pains as five freshmen (goalkeeper Megan Pyrz, defender Sarah Gorden, midfielder Amber Paul and forwards Rachel Pitman and Nikki Condit) either started or played significant minutes.
- DePaul had eight losses by a single goal, including four in overtime.

**Georgetown (15-6-0)
8-3-0 BIG EAST**

- The Hoyas beat Syracuse 3-1 on Oct. 30 in the quarterfinals of the BIG EAST Championship and lost to West Virginia 5-1 in the semifinals on Nov. 4. GU moved to 3-9-0 all-time in tournament play.
- The 15 wins for Georgetown ties a school record set last year.
- GU also advanced to the semifinals in 2007, the last time it was held in Morgantown.

**Louisville (14-7-3)
8-1-2 BIG EAST**

- Louisville earned its third NCAA Championship appearance. This year, the Cardinals posted their first NCAA Championship wins.
- Louisville set a school record for wins, surpassing the previous mark of 13 set in back-to-back seasons in 2006 and 2007.
- The 2011 BIG EAST Conference National Division champions, hosted an NCAA match for the first time in the program's history.
- The Cardinals are their third NCAA Championship appearance overall. It will be their first NCAA appearance since back-to-back berths in 2006 and 2007.
- The Cardinals' 26 points in league play are their highest since joining the conference in 2005.

**Marquette (18-4-0)
10-1-0 BIG EAST**

- MU earns its fourth consecutive trip to the NCAA Championship and its 10th overall.
- The Golden Eagles tied West Virginia for the league's American Division crown.
- The regular-season title was MU's seventh overall. Marquette has won regular season conference championships in 1996, 1997, 1999, 2000, 2009, 2010, and 2011.
- The Golden Eagles are 7-8-3 all-time in the NCAA Championship, including a 6-3-1 mark in first round games.

**Notre Dame (10-8-3)
6-3-2 BIG EAST**

- The Irish were selected for their 19th straight NCAA Championship.
- ND lost in the first round of the NCAA Championship for the first time since 1993.
- Senior Melissa Henderson finished in fourth place on Notre Dame's career goals list (70) and 9th on its all-time points list (165).
- ND was 42-3-3 all-time when Henderson scored a goal and 53-3-3 all-time when she notched a point.
- The Fighting Irish moved to 59-16-1 all-time record (.783) in NCAA tournament play.

**Pittsburgh (2-13-4)
1-8-2 BIG EAST**

- The Panthers closed out the year with a 1-0 loss to then-No. 18/17 West Virginia on Oct. 21.
- Katie Ruhe, Katheryn Kunugi and Kristina Rioux were honored before the game for Senior Night. Junior Ashley Cuba was honored at halftime on recently becoming the school's all-time leader in goals (21).
- Ruhe graduates as Pitt's all-time leader in assists with 17. She also is seventh at Pitt in career points.

**Providence (8-9-4)
5-6-0 BIG EAST**

- The Friars knocked off rival UConn 2-1 on Oct. 22 to propel them into the BIG EAST Championship for the first time since 1994.
- Providence then beat Rutgers 1-0 in the First Round of the Championship to earn their first tournament win since 1993.
- Providence qualified for its first BIG EAST Championship under the direction on seventh-year head coach Jim McGirr.
- PC lost in the quarterfinals at Louisville 2-0 on Oct. 30.

**Rutgers (8-8-3)
3-5-3 BIG EAST**

- The Scarlet Knights closed out the regular-season with a 2-2 draw against Seton Hall on Oct. 21.
- Rutgers secured the National Division No. 5 spot in the BIG EAST Championship and lost at American Division No. 4 seed Providence 1-0 on Oct. 27.

**St. John's (9-9-1)
5-6-0 BIG EAST**

- St. John's defeated Syracuse 2-0 in the regular season finale at Belson Stadium on Oct. 21 and earned a berth as the American Division No. 5 seed in the BIG EAST Championship.
- The Red Storm hosted record-breaking women's soccer crowd of 1,910 at Belson Stadium for the contest.
- The No. 5 seeded Red Storm lost at National Division No. 4 Seton Hall 1-0 on Oct. 27.

**Seton Hall (9-8-3)
4-6-1 BIG EAST**

- Seton Hall qualified for its first BIG EAST Championship since 2006. It was the No. 4 seed from the National Division.
- The Pirates beat American Division No. 5 seed St. John's 1-0 on Oct. 27 and avenged a defeat earlier season 2-1 on Oct. 2.
- Seton Hall lost at West Virginia 5-0 in the quarterfinals on Oct. 30.

**USF (6-8-4)
2-6-3 BIG EAST**

- USF closed out the regular-season with a 2-0 loss at Marquette on Oct. 22.

**Syracuse (7-8-3)
6-5-0 BIG EAST**

- Syracuse clinched a spot in the BIG EAST Championship and was the No. 3 seed in the American Division earning a bye to the quarterfinals.
- The Orange made their first appearance in the conference championship since 2005. The Orange have an all-time record of 2-5-0 in the league championship. Syracuse's last win in the tournament was a 3-1 win against Rutgers in 2000.
- SU recorded its seventh win of the season against USF on Oct. 14. It is the most victories since head coach Phil Wheddon took over the program prior to 2008.

**Villanova (8-9-2)
4-7-0 BIG EAST**

- Senior forward Katie Ryan became the third player in school history to reach 100 career points when she scored two goals in a 3-2 win at DePaul on Oct. 14. Ryan accomplished another milestone on Oct. 16, as her goal at Notre Dame was the 40th of her career. Ryan has totaled 40 goals, 22 assists and 102 points during her time on the Main Line.
- Ryan led Villanova with 29 points (12 goals, five assists) this season, while redshirt freshman midfielder Stephanie Myers (seven goals, five assists) and junior forward Heidi Sabatura (six goals, seven assists) have 19 points apiece. It is the first time that the Wildcats have three players with at least 19 points in a season since at least 1996.
- Ryan's 12 goals this year were a single-season career high.

**West Virginia (17-5-0)
10-1-0 BIG EAST**

- Lost in the first round of the NCAA Championship at home 1-0 to Virginia Tech on Nov. 12.
- The loss marked only the fourth first round exit in 12 NCAA Championship appearances.
- The Mountaineers won their second consecutive BIG EAST Championship and their third title in the last five years.
- The Mountaineers have won five BIG EAST division crowns under coach Nikki Izzo-Brown.

Midfielder of the Year

Ingrid Wells, Georgetown, R-Sr., M

Two-time BIG EAST Midfielder of the Year Ingrid Wells earned her honor after accumulating 17 points, including a league-best nine assists, during conference play. The only unanimous All-BIG EAST selection, Wells was named to the M.A.C. Hermann Trophy Watch List as one of the top players in the nation. She helped boost the Hoyas' offense, which ranked among the league leaders at 2.60 goals per game. In all games, the redshirt senior leads the team with 30 points, including 12 assists. Wells scored a pair of game-winning goals this season and is arguably one of the most dynamic players in the league. She is the first player to win back-to-back Midfielder of the Year honors since UConn's Meghan Schnur in 2006-07.



Coach of the Year

Karen Ferguson-Dayes, Louisville

Head coach Karen Ferguson-Dayes has led the Cardinals (8-1-2 BIG EAST) to a No. 1 seed in the BIG EAST Championship, their first, and earned BIG EAST Coach of the Year honors. The Cardinals also are unbeaten in 12 of their last 13 games, and won a school-record eight conference games. Picked to finish fourth in the league's preseason poll, Louisville won its first BIG EAST National Division crown. Ferguson-Dayes is in her 11th season with Louisville.

Offensive Player of the Year

Christine Exeter, Louisville, So., F

Exeter earned BIG EAST Offensive Player of the Year honors after totaling 24 points and scoring a league-leading 11 goals in conference action. The sophomore recorded at least one point in 11 of 12 league games, and tallied 29 points overall. Exeter also helped lead the Cardinals to their first BIG EAST regular-season crown as the National Division champions. Last year, Exeter was the first Louisville player to earn one of the league's major awards after being tabbed BIG EAST Rookie of the Year. Exeter also is the first sophomore to earn Offensive Player of the Year honors since Notre Dame's Kerri Hanks in 2006.



Defensive Player of the Year

Kerry McBride, Marquette, Jr., D

McBride was named BIG EAST Defensive Player of the Year for the second straight season. The senior helped lead one of the league's top defenses, allowing just seven goals in 11 conference games and posting a 0.63 goals-against average. Outside of conference action, Marquette ranked first in the BIG EAST with a 0.64 goals-against average and 12 shutouts. McBride also helped limit Marquette opponents to just 2.5 shots on goal per game. Earlier in the season, McBride was named to the M.A.C. Hermann Trophy Watch List as one of the top players in the nation. She is the first player to win back-to-back Defensive Player of the Year honors since Notre Dame's Jen Grubb in 1998-99.



Goalkeeper of the Year

Natalie Kulla, Marquette, Sr., GK

For the second straight year, Kulla followed her Preseason Goalkeeper of the Year selection with the BIG EAST Goalkeeper of the Year honor. Holding a league-leading 0.66 goals-against average, Kulla helped lead Marquette to its third consecutive American Division title. The senior totaled seven shutouts in conference action and anchored a team that ranked first in the league in goals-against average at 0.64. In all games, Kulla totaled 10 shutouts and held a 0.67 goals-against average. She is the first person to win back-to-back Goalkeeper of the Year honors since Villanova's Jillian Loyden (2005-2007).



Rookie of the Year

Kate Schwindel, West Virginia, Fr., F

Schwindel was tabbed the BIG EAST Rookie of the Year after totaling 16 points, including five goals this year. In league play she had 15 points, including five goals, to rank among the BIG EAST leaders. She also earned BIG EAST Rookie of the Week honors on Oct. 10. Schwindel is the first West Virginia player to be named BIG EAST Rookie of the Year since Ashley Banks shared the honor with Kia McNeill (Boston College) in 2004.



Team Fair Play Award

Notre Dame

Notre Dame, under the direction of 13th-year head coach Randy Waldrum, earns the third annual team Fair Play Award after totaling just 77 points (67 fouls, two yellow cards and zero red cards) during conference play. The Fair Play Award is given to the team that accumulates the fewest points using the following scoring system: foul (one point), yellow card (five points) and red card (10 points).

West Virginia Captures Third Women's Soccer Crown

MORGANTOWN, W.Va. – West Virginia (17-4-0) beat Louisville (12-6-3) by the score of 2-0 in the title game of the BIG EAST women's soccer championship on Nov. 6. With the win, the Mountaineers captured their second consecutive tournament title and third overall. The Mountaineers also earned the league's automatic berth into the 64-team Division I NCAA Championship.

"Special teams do special things, and it takes a special team to win back-to-back championships in this league," said WVU head coach Nikki Izzo-Brown. "You'll never be disappointed by the hard work these women put on the field."

Senior Blake Miller knocked home a penalty kick 27:13 into the contest to open the scoring. Miller buried it into the lower left corner, kissing it off the left post. Miller has scored in four of the last five games, and recorded a point in eight straight. The Mountaineers also improved to 27-2-1 when Miller scores a goal.

In the 49th minute, sophomore Frances Silva punched in a beautiful cross from junior Bry McCarthy. It was her eighth goal of the year and gave the Mountaineers a 2-0 advantage.

WVU freshman goalkeeper Sara Keane was excellent in net making five saves to preserve the shutout.

The match took place before a sun-baked capacity crowd of more than 1,550 at Dick Dlesk Soccer Stadium. The Mountaineers also won their sixth straight BIG EAST Championship match. Their last loss in the league tournament came in semifinals of the 2009 Championship.

"If we're winning three (championship titles) in five years, that's pretty damn good," reiterated Izzo-Brown.

Louisville goalkeeper Chloe Kiefer made one save. Offensively, sophomore Christine Exeter was held to just one shot.

Louisville Beats Notre Dame 2-1 In Semifinal No. 1

MORGANTOWN, W.Va. – Under sun-splashed and brilliant fall weather at Dick Dlesk Soccer Stadium, Louisville (12-5-3) knocked off Notre Dame (10-7-3) by the score of 2-1 in the semifinals of the BIG EAST women's soccer championship on Nov. 4. The Cardinals scored a pair of goals in the opening minutes of the contest and held off a late ND charge for the win.

Sophomore Christine Exeter, the BIG EAST Offensive Player of the Year, tallied the first score just 2:27 into the contest. Sophomore Jordan Pawlik and senior Katie McDonald each picked up an assist on the play. It was Exeter's team-leading 14th goal of the year.

McDonald followed a few minutes later with a score of her own as she knocked home a throw-in from the corner.

Notre Dame answered as sophomore forward Adriana Leon blasted home a goal from 20-yards out in the 72nd minute. In fact, the Irish peppered Louisville goalkeeper Chloe Kiefer with 12 shots over the final 45 minutes, forcing her to make four saves. Keifer totaled seven saves in the contest.

Notre Dame goalkeeper Maddie Fox had four saves. The Irish also held an 11-3 edge in corner kicks.

With the win, Louisville makes its first appearance in the title game of the BIG EAST Championship. The loss moved Notre Dame to 36-4-1 during BIG EAST Championship play.

WVU Tops Georgetown 5-1 In Semifinal No. 2

MORGANTOWN, W.Va. – West Virginia (16-4-0) beat Georgetown (15-6-0) by the score of 5-1 in the semifinals of the BIG EAST women's soccer championship on Nov. 4. The Mountaineers scored four unanswered goals to break a 1-1 tie in the second-half and will make a return appearance in the title game of the league tournament. West Virginia won last year's event and has been in the title game three of the last five years.

Five different players accounted for the WVU goals, including freshman Kate Schwindel, who was named the BIG EAST Rookie of the Year on Thursday night. Schwindel scored in the 61st minute and also had an assist on West Virginia's third goal in the 57th minute.

WVU got on the board first as senior Blake Miller netted her ninth goal of the year in the 4th minute. A goal from Georgetown senior forward Samantha Baker tied the game midway through the first half.

Tied 1-1 at halftime, WVU took control over the final 45 minutes. The five goals match WVU's highest scoring output during BIG EAST Championship play, also matches last weekend against Seton Hall. Georgetown out-shot West Virginia 11-10 and had a 9-4 advantage in corner kicks.

With the win, West Virginia will face Louisville on Sunday at noon. The teams did not meet during the regular season, but WVU won the most recent meeting 2-1 on Oct. 3, 2010.

The loss ends a four-game win streak for the Hoyas. Georgetown played in the semifinals of the BIG EAST Championship for the second time in program history.

13 BIG EAST PLAYERS CITED

PROVIDENCE, R.I. – Thirteen BIG EAST women's soccer players have been named to the CoSIDA Academic All-District teams presented by Capital One. The league landed nine first-team selections and three second-team picks. Marquette leads the league with four selections, while St. John's and Notre Dame each had three.

Overall, six different BIG EAST teams are represented on the list. First-team selections have the opportunity to be named to the CoSIDA Academic All-America team, which will be released later in the month.

BIG EAST MEMBERS IN THE NCAA CHAMPIONSHIP

A BIG EAST team has advanced to the College Cup as one of the four remaining teams in the championship 12 times in the past 17 years (since 1995). Since joining the BIG EAST in 1995, ND has advanced to the title game seven times (1995, 1996, 1999, 2004, 2006, 2008 and 2010), while Connecticut has been to the title game twice during that span (1997 and 2003).
