**ATTACK PLAYER OF THE YEAR**

**Grace Gavin, Loyola, Sr., A**

Gavin was named the BIG EAST Attack Player of the Year after totaling 80 points, including 59 goals and 21 assists. The senior also helped her team clinch its second straight berth to the BIG EAST Championship. In conference play, she had a league-best 40 points and tied for the conference lead with 28 goals. The senior scored at least two goals and registered at least three points in every game this season. This is the second straight year Gavin has earned BIG EAST Attack Player of the Year honors and the third league player to earn the award multiple times. Gavin is just the second to do it in back-to-back years. In the regular-season finale, Gavin also became the school's all-time leading scorer and has totaled 293 career points.

**MIDFIELDER OF THE YEAR**

**Sophia Thomas, Georgetown, So., M**

Thomas was named the BIG EAST Midfielder of the Year after helping the Hoyas to the No. 1 seed in the BIG EAST Championship. She ranked among the league leaders in goals with 35 and ranked second on the team with 43 points. Thomas also tallied a team-leading 38 ground balls, along with 23 draw controls. In conference play, Thomas had a team-high 29 points, including 24 goals. Thomas also was an All-BIG EAST First Team selection. She is the first sophomore to win the award since 2005 (Katie Batiuk, Rutgers) and just the second ever. Thomas also is just the third Georgetown player to earn BIG EAST Midfielder of the Year honors joining Ashby Kaestner (2009) and Gloria Lozano (2003).

**DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE YEAR**

**Logan McCraw, Georgetown, Sr., D**

McCraw was named the BIG EAST Defensive Player of the Year after helping Georgetown to the No. 1 seed in the BIG EAST Championship. The Hoyas held their opponents to just 11.3 goals per game and lowered that mark to just 10.0 goals in conference play. McCraw totaled 39 draw controls and ranked among the league leaders. She also had 28 ground balls. The senior played in all 16 games for the Hoyas this year and appeared in every contest since coming to Georgetown in 2007-08. A first-team all-conference selection, McCraw is the eighth Georgetown recipient to win BIG EAST Defensive Player of the Year honors. She joins former Hoyas Bridget Noon (2009), Maggie Koch (2006, 2007), Chloe Asselin (2005), Michi Ellers (2003, 2004) and Caitlin McLean (2001).

**THE INSIDE SCOOP**

**Grace Gavin Leads Loyola** – Senior Grace Gavin paced all players with five goals and two assists in Loyola's season-finale at North Carolina in the NCAA Championship second round. During the game, Gavin broke a 32-year old record for goals in a season. She finished 2011 with 71, becoming the first player in Loyola history to cross the 70-goal mark, and topping the 1979 mark of 68 set by Mary Beth Arke.

Gavin concluded her Greyhounds' career with career records in goals (229) and points (311). She finished second all-time with 82 assists and 154 draw controls. Gavin's 311 points are 16th all-time in NCAA Division I history, while her 228 goals are tied for 16th. Gavin is the first Greyhounds' player to eclipse the 300-point mark.

In addition to her goals in a season record, Gavin set the single-season points scored mark with 98. She also scored at least one point in 70-of-71 career games, and she had a goal in 68-of-71. Gavin ended her career second all-time at Loyola in both assists (82) and draw controls (154).

Gavin also is a finalist for the Tewaaron and Honda Awards.

Loyola placed a conference-high eight players on the All-BIG EAST teams, led by first-team honorees Grace Gavin and Abby Rehfluss. Gavin also was named the BIG EAST Attack Player of the Year for the second season in a row.

### **COACHES OF THE YEAR**

#### **Jen Adams, Loyola**

Entering her third season with Loyola, Adams earns her first BIG EAST Coach of the Year award. She helped the Greyhounds post a 14-2 mark during the regular-season and a national ranking during the last two months of the year. Ranked as high as No. 3, Loyola has three wins over ranked teams this season. Adams also helped a league-high eight Loyola players earn all-conference honors, including BIG EAST Attack Player of the Year Grace Gavin.



#### **Gary Gait, Syracuse**

Entering his fourth season with Syracuse, Gait earns his first BIG EAST Coach of the Year honor following a 7-1 mark in league play. The Orange are 10-7 overall and have faced eight nationally ranked opponents this year. Syracuse has been nationally ranked all season, including as high as No. 5. Gait is in his fourth year with the Orange.

## BIG EAST CHAMPIONSHIP REVIEW • MAY 5 & 7 • GEORGETOWN UNIVERSITY

**SEMIFINAL #1** – The No. 3 seed Loyola University women’s lacrosse team held off a furious second half rally by Syracuse, and beat the No. 2 seed Orange 12-11 in the semifinals of the BIG EAST Women’s Lacrosse Championship on May 5. Senior Grace Gavin scored a game-high four goals to lead the Greyhounds (15-2), which advance to their first BIG EAST Championship title game.

The Greyhounds raced out a 6-0 lead with 10:37 left in the first half and held a 7-3 advantage at halftime. However the Orange (10-8) scored three of the final four goals to close out the frame and carried some momentum into the intermission.

Gavin tallied three of her four goals in the first half.

In the second half, Loyola opened up a 10-4 advantage with 17:01 left in the contest before Syracuse began to rally. The Orange five of the next six goals and cut it to two, 11-9, with 6:27 remaining in regulation. A Loyola goal by senior Meg Decker pushed the lead back to three, 12-9 with 3:26 left, and proved to be the gamewinner. Syracuse tacked on two goals down the stretch, but it was not enough.

Each team totaled 11 ground balls, while Syracuse held a 15-10 edge in draw controls.

Loyola goalkeeper Kerry Stoothoff had seven saves, while Syracuse counterpart Liz Hogan made six.

**SEMIFINAL #2** – The No. 4 seed Notre Dame upset No. 1 seed Georgetown 15-12 in the semifinals of the BIG EAST Women’s Lacrosse Championship held at Georgetown University on May 5. Senior Shaylyn Blaney had four points, as did junior teammate Maggie Tamasitis to lead the Irish (10-8), who advanced to the title game for the second time in school history and first time since 2009. Blaney scored a game-high four goals, while Tamasitis registered a game-high four assists.

The Hoyas jumped out to a 4-1 lead, capped by sophomore Dina Jackson’s goal with 21:00 left in the first half. The Irish roared back with three of the next four goals to cut it to one, 5-4 with 16:36 remaining in the frame. The scoring splurge continued as Georgetown scored three of the next four goals and opened up an 8-5 advantage with 14:11 to go in the session. Notre Dame scored the final five goals of the half and held a 10-8 lead at the intermission. In total 18 goals were scored in the first half. Just nine goals were tallied over the final 30 minutes.

In the second half, Notre Dame scored five of the final seven goals and held on for the win. Blaney accounted for the final two Irish goals to ice it.

Notre Dame sophomore goalkeeper Ellie Hilling made six saves in net. Hoyas freshman Barb Black recorded three saves. Senior Jordy Kirr led Georgetown with three points, including two goals.

The Irish totaled 33 shots, including 18 shots on goal. Georgetown had 23 attempts with 18 on net.

There were three ties and two lead changes.

The score was not the highest total in championship play. Syracuse and Rutgers combined for 29 goals in the 2008 semifinal.

**TITLE GAME** – No. 3 seed Loyola University topped No. 4 seed Notre Dame 12-10 and earned its first BIG EAST Women’s Lacrosse Championship before a sun-soaked crowd of more than 800 at Georgetown’s Multi-Sport Field on May 7. The Greyhounds (16-2) were led by senior attack Grace Gavin who had four points and junior goalkeeper Kerry Stoothoff who made 10 saves. Stoothoff also was named the tournament’s Most Outstanding Player.

Following a hotly contested and evenly played first half, Notre Dame held a slim 7-6 advantage on the scoreboard. Six different Irish players accounted for the first-half scores.

Gavin had two first-half scores for Loyola, while senior teammate Abby Rehfluss added two goals. Rehfluss, who also totaled three draw controls, was named to the all-tournament team.

Loyola began the second half with four of the first five goals, and opened up a 10-8 lead with 10:06 remaining in regulation. Notre Dame cut it to one, 11-10 with 5:29 left, but Loyola came right back as freshman Taryn Vanthof scored her first goal of the game on a free position opportunity with 4:37 showing on the clock.

A pair of Notre Dame penalties in the closing minutes helped give Loyola the win.

Gavin, who last week became the school’s leading point-getter, became Loyola’s leading goal-scorer with three goals this afternoon. The senior has totaled 301 points in her illustrious career, including 224 goals and 77 assists. She broke the Loyola record held by Janet Eisenhut who played from 1980-83 of 223. Gavin also is the first person in school history to surpass 300 points and the 23rd in Division I NCAA history.

Senior Kellye Gallagher grabbed a career-high seven ground balls and helped Loyola hold a 20-19 edge in that category.

The Irish held a 15-5 advantage in draw controls, led by seniors Shaylyn Blaney and Jackie Doherty who had three apiece. Doherty also notched a team-high four ground balls. Both were selected to the all-tournament team. Notre Dame goalkeeper Ellie Hilling made five saves.

With the win Loyola earned the league’s automatic berth into the 16-team NCAA Championship field.

**Cincinnati (2-14)**
**0-8 BIG EAST**

**LAST GAME:** Wrapped up the season with a 17-6 loss to Notre Dame at home on Senior Day on May 1.

**NOTES:**

- Against Notre Dame, senior Allison Bell had a hat trick, tallying her first three goals since the 2008 season.

- Sophomore Katie Kiriazoglou, junior MacKenzie Parsons, and junior Laura Simanski each had a goal. Kiriazoglou added three assists, while Parsons finished with one.

- Prior to the first draw, UC honored its seven-member senior class of Bell, Lynsey Burton, Lauren Kelly, Haley Marvine, Karen Skelton, Natalie Starvaggi, and Paige Stratton with an on-field ceremony and video on CATSVISION. This group was the first four-year class in the program's history.

- On the season, Kiriazoglou led the team with 38 points, including 22 assists.

**Connecticut (9-7)**
**3-5 BIG EAST**

**LAST GAME:** Lost at No. 7/5 Loyola 17-10 on May 1.

**NOTES:**

- The Huskies ended the 2011 season with a 9-7 overall record and a 3-5 mark in conference play.

- The three BIG EAST wins are the most since the 2005 season when the Huskies had a 3-2 record.

- M.E. Lapham set a UConn record for goals in a season as she ended the year with 55. The junior also tallied a team-high 63 points.

- Freshman Lauren Kahn had 51 points, including 38 goals.

**Georgetown (9-8)**
**7-1 BIG EAST**

**LAST GAME:** Lost to Notre Dame 15-12 in the semifinals of the BIG EAST Championship on May 5.

**NOTES:**

- Clinched a share of the BIG EAST regular-season championship. Georgetown earned the No. 1 seed in the BIG EAST Championship.

- The BIG EAST regular-season title is Georgetown's 10th in the past 11 years and the fourth time in five tries that the squad has been the top seed in the conference tournament.

- Senior Jordy Kirr led the team with 52 points, including 26 goals and 26 assists.

- Sophomore Sophia Thomas, the BIG EAST Midfielder of the Year, added 45 points, including 37 goals.

**Louisville (10-7)**
**3-5 BIG EAST**

**LAST GAME:** Louisville lost to Notre Dame 16-15 in a loss on a last-second goal by the Fighting Irish that concluded 12 Cardinal careers on April 29 at the UofL Lacrosse Stadium.

**NOTES:**

- Senior Emily Dashiell had 247 draw controls, 174 ground balls and 107 caused turnovers for her career. According to the NCAA, Dashiell ranks eighth all-time in draw controls.

- Senior Bergan Foley totaled 265 goals for her career, which ranked her fourth all-time in NCAA history. In 2011, she had 71 points, including 65 goals.

- Liz Lovejoy had 68 points, including 57 goals, while Katie Oliverio had 64 points, including 43 assists.

**Loyola (17-3)**
**6-2 BIG EAST**

**LAST GAME:** Beat UMass 14-7 in the First Round of the NCAA Championship on May 14.

**NOTES:**

- Last Saturday's victory in the NCAA First Round over Massachusetts was Loyola's 17th of 2011, tying the school record for victories in a season. The 2003 team that advanced to the NCAA Final Four also won 17 games and finished with a 17-2 record.

- Against North Carolina, Gavin paced all players with five goals and two assists. During the game, Gavin broke a 32-year old record for goals in a season. She finished 2011 with 71, becoming the first player in Loyola history to cross the 70-goal mark, and topping the 1979 mark of 68 set by Mary Beth Arke.

- Gavin concluded her Greyhounds' career with career records in goals (229) and points (311). She finished second all-time with 82 assists and 154 draw controls. Abby Rehuss will close her career third all-time at Loyola with 153 draw controls, and Cara Filippelli is third with 85 caused turnovers.

**Notre Dame (10-9)**
**6-2 BIG EAST**

**LAST GAME:** Lost to Loyola 12-10 in the title game of the BIG EAST Championship on May 7.

**NOTES:**

- Notre Dame clinched a spot in the BIG EAST Tournament with a 16-15 win over Louisville on April 29. The Irish have played in all five BIG EAST Championships, winning the event in 2009.

- Maggie Tamasitis led the team with 67 points, including 46 assists.

- Seniors Shaylyn Blaney (46 points, 41 draw controls, 40 ground balls) and Jackie Doherty (55 ground balls, 41 draw controls) also were key contributors.



## BIG EAST NEWS & NOTES

### Rutgers (9-7)

#### 3-5 BIG EAST

**LAST GAME:** Lost a close game to No. 16/17 Georgetown at home 9-8 on May 1.

#### NOTES:

- Senior attacker Katherine Marino led the Scarlet Knights with two goals and three assists.

- Rutgers honored its six graduating seniors – Marino, Kristen Anderson, Eileen Ghent, Shawn Lopez, Mary Moran, Marlena Welsh – in a pregame ceremony.

- The battle between Rutgers and Georgetown was tight throughout, evident by the seven ties and five lead changes. In addition to Marino, Anderson and freshman midfielder Lauren Sbrilli each tallied a pair of goals against the Hoyas to help lead the Rutgers effort.

- The game remained knotted at 3-3 at halftime.

- The Scarlet Knights made a push for the win, scoring two goals in a one-minute span, including the go-ahead tally at 10:33 to lead 8-7. GU tied it 8-8 and scored a goal with two minutes left to play.

### Syracuse (10-8)

#### 7-1 BIG EAST

**LAST GAME:** Saw a five-game winning streak snapped with a 12-11 loss to Loyola in the semifinals of the BIG EAST Championship on May 5.

#### NOTES:

- Syracuse claimed a share of the BIG EAST regular season crown. It marks the fourth time in the last five years that the Orange has either won or shared the conference regular-season title.

- Michelle Tumolo led the Orange with 63 points, including 33 assists. She also had 20 ground balls and 11 draw controls.

- Tee Ladouceur added 54 points, including 36 goals.

- The Orange have an all-time record of 92-21 (.814) in the Carrier Dome since the program began in 1998.

- Liz Hogan was named to the Capital One Academic All-District I At-Large Second Team. To be eligible, student-athletes must achieve sophomore standing at their current school and possess a cumulative GPA-of at least 3.3.

### Villanova (5-11)

#### 1-7 BIG EAST

**LAST GAME:** Lost to Syracuse 20-6 in its regular-season finale on May 1.

#### NOTES:

- Jebb Chagan stepped down as head coach on May 9.

- "Jebb has been an exemplary coach for the past seven years and represented the University and the women's lacrosse program in a first class manner," stated Villanova Director of Athletics Vince Nicastro.

- Chagan was named head coach in 2005 after serving one season as an assistant. Over the following six years, Villanova charted a clear path to improvement, winning 35 games and transitioning from an independent into the BIG EAST, a league which boasted no fewer than five teams ranked in the national top 25 this season.

- Chagan departs Villanova with the most wins of any coach in program history.

### BIG EAST

- A record six BIG EAST games were carried on CBS Sports Network in 2011. This includes three regular-season dates, both semifinal games of the 2011 BIG EAST Championship on May 5 as well as the title game May 7.

- The 2011 BIG EAST Women's Lacrosse Championship returns to Georgetown University on May 5 and 7. It will be the second time the league championship will be held in the nation's capital and the first time since 2009.

- The 2012 BIG EAST Women's Lacrosse Championship will be held at Syracuse University. It will be the second time the league championship will be held in upstate New York and the first time since the inaugural league title was handed out in 2007.

- The 2013 BIG EAST Women's Lacrosse Championship will be held at Loyola on May 2 and 4. The 6,000 seat Ridley Athletic Complex opened in March of 2010. It will be the first time the facility has hosted the event.

### 2011 Tewaaraton Award

- Loyola senior attacker Grace Gavin has been named one of five finalists for the 2011 Tewaaraton Award, given annually to the top player in men's and women's lacrosse by the Greater Washington Sports Alliance.

Four other finalists – Duke's Emma Hamm, Maryland's Sarah Mollison and Katie Schwarzmann and Northwestern's Shannon Smith – will join her at the Tewaaraton presentation on June 2 at the Warner Theatre in Washington, D.C.

Gavin is the second player from Loyola to be named a finalist since the award's inception in 2001, joining Suzanne Eyler who was tabbed in 2003. Event details can be found at [TewaaratonAward.org](http://TewaaratonAward.org).

While Gavin would be the first person from Loyola to win the Tewaaraton Trophy, she would not be the first person currently associated with the program to earn the award. Adams won the inaugural trophy in 2001, and Assistant Coach Katie Chrest won the 2005 award after her senior season at Duke. Assistant Coach Dana Dobbie was a finalist for the award in 2008. Only one BIG EAST player has won the Tewaaraton Trophy, Georgetown's Erin Elbe in 2002.

### Marquette

- On Dec. 16, 2010, Marquette University announced it will add men's and women's lacrosse to its NCAA Division I varsity sports offerings. Both teams will begin competition in spring 2013.

- The Golden Eagles will play as an independent their first season of competition (2013), before becoming a full member of the BIG EAST Conference in men's and women's lacrosse in 2014.

- On Feb. 4, 2011, Marquette announced the hiring of Meredith Simon Black (Notre Dame '04) as its first women's head coach. Joe Amplo will coach the men. Simon Black will spend the 2011 season at her current institution, California-Berkeley and join Marquette with almost two years to assemble a coaching staff and build a roster.

- Simon Black arrives at Marquette after spending the last six years as an assistant coach at Towson, Notre Dame and Cal. She helped Towson and Notre Dame to a combined four NCAA Championship appearances and is in her first season at Cal.

**BIG EAST NEWS & NOTES**

The Intercollegiate Women's Lacrosse Coaches Association (IWLCA) has honored 51 student-athletes in Division I with a selection on the 2011 All-America teams.
